## COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

### REQUIRED COURSES

**English 7** is the study of grammar and usage, vocabulary and spelling, and clear, effective writing.

**Pre-AP English 7** is a transition into a more advanced study of literature, language and writing. The course develops reasoning and critical thinking skills and the ability to analyze and discuss in preparation for AP English courses.

**Reading** is a course designed to improve reading skills in comprehension and vocabulary through a literary approach.

**Mathematics 7** follows the Connected Mathematics Project curriculum which uses an investigative approach to learning algebraic, probability, and geometric concepts.

**Pre-AP Mathematics 7** provides a greater depth of content in the Connected Mathematics Project curriculum by adding investigations in data analysis and probability, algebra, measurement and geometry which are not included in Mathematics 7.

**Science 7** is an integrated, hands-on approach to learning life, earth, and physical science concepts.

**Pre-AP Science 7** provides an in-depth exploration of four strands: Nature of Science, Life Science, Physical Science and Earth and Space Science. The course emphasizes laboratory skills and thinking skills in preparation for AP science courses.

**Social Studies 7** provide a study of the world through four strands: geography, civics, history, and economics.

**Pre-AP Social Studies 7** provides a study of the world through four strands: Geography, Civics, History and Economics. The course provides a greater depth of instruction and broadens the concept of humanity within a global context in preparation for AP social studies courses.

**Arkansas History** provides a study of the history of Arkansas. The course addresses the geographic features and economics of our state, focusing on political, social religious, military, scientific, and cultural developments that have occurred over time.

**Physical Education and Health - Regular** is designed to develop motor skills, improve coordination and provide students with an understanding of personal health wellness.

**Physical Education and Health - Sports** is designed for students who plan to take part in competitive athletics and to provide students with an understanding of personal health wellness.

**Developmental Reading** is provided for students requiring additional instruction to master basic reading skills.

### ELECTIVE COURSES

**Band** is the study of instrumental music and includes many types of compositions from classical to modern. Students learn to play an instrument and gain an appreciation of many forms of music.

**Boys/Girls Choir** is the study of vocal music. Students learn to sing as a choir and to develop an appreciation of music.

### **ROTATION:**

**Art** introduces students to the principles of design and color as applied to various art activities.  
*One-semester course.*

**Keyboarding** emphasizes the mastery of the keyboard with desirable keyboarding techniques, development of speed and accuracy, and use of basic applications such as centering and arranging reports, letters, and tables. *One-semester course.*
